#### INTRODUCTION

The mission of Icahn Charter School 4 is to use the Core Knowledge curriculum developed by E. D. Hirsch to provide students with a rigorous academic program offered in an extended day/year setting. Students will graduate armed with the skills and knowledge to participate successfully in the most rigorous academic environments, and will have a sense of personal and community responsibility. Icahn Charter School 4 opened in September 2010 and served grades kindergarten through second grade. Our school is composed of 59.1% African American, and 37.% Latin, .89 Pacific Islander, . 44 Caucasian, and 1.7 Other, with a free and reduced lunch rate of 88.9%.

Our instructional program is data driven and combines Core Knowledge with ongoing assessments. Children who have demonstrated a deficiency in ELA or Mathematics as evident by the results of an assessment test are placed in our Targeted Assistance Program. Our Targeted Assistance Program consists of in school remediation, and after school tutoring. We have an extended school day of 7.5 hours and an extended school year ranging from 190 to 192 days of instruction.

#### **Goal 1: English Language Arts**

Students will become proficient readers of the English Language

#### **Background**

The English Language Arts Core Knowledge Curriculum is supported through the McMillan-McGraw Hill Reading Program supplemented by Classroom Leveled Libraries and the Waterford Early learning Program, which integrates the use of technology and fundamental reading instruction. Our Grade 3<sup>rd</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> students were administered the New York State English Language Arts Examination in April 2013.

#### **Goal 1: Absolute Measure**

Each year, 75 percent of all tested students enrolled in at least their second year will perform at proficiency on the New York State English language arts examination for grades 3-8.<sup>1</sup>

#### Method

The ICAHN 4 administered the New York State Testing Program English language arts assessment to students in 3 through 5 grades in April 2013. Each student's raw score has been converted to a grade-specific scaled score and a performance level.

The table below summarizes participation information for this year's test administration. The table indicates total enrollment and total number of students tested. It also provides a detailed breakdown of those students excluded from the exam. Note that this table includes all students according to grade level, even if they have not enrolled in at least their second year.

#### Results

2012-13 is the first year NYS testing has been based on the core curriculum standards. The results constitute a baseline for use in subsequent years. They also display a significant difference between the proficiency levels achieved as compared with the school's performance measures, where 75% of students are to demonstrate proficiency. When students who have not been enrolled at the school for at least two years were subtracted from the total proficiency levels dropped at each grade level.

Students completing the NYS  $3^{rd}$  through  $5^{th}$  grade ELA assessments had either been enrolled at the school for at least two years, or were newer to the school. The table below illustrates the difference between those who have been enrolled for at least two years, and others who enrolled later as follows: Grade 3-37 and 1=38; Grade 4-31 and 6=37; and Grade 5-28 and 3=33.

The measure was not met.

#### **Additional Evidence**

During the first two years ICAHN 4 students met and surpassed the Goal 1 Absolute Measure. In 2011-12 100% of students demonstrated proficiency. They success was 20% higher than their 2010-11 peers. With the move to testing based on the Common Core Learning Standards, a new baseline is being established. A comparison cannot be made between 2012-13 student results and those of previous years. If the 2010-11 to 2011-12 trend is continued, 2013-14 assessment results should show more students are demonstrating proficiency even though proficiency will may not be met until the following year.

#### **Goal 1: Absolute Measure**

Each year, the school's aggregate Performance Level Index (PLI) on the State English language arts exam will meet the Annual Measurable Objective (AMO) set forth in the state's NCLB accountability system.

#### Method

The federal No Child Left Behind law holds schools accountable for making annual yearly progress towards enabling all students to be proficient. As a result, the state sets an Annual Measurable Objective (AMO) each year to determine if schools are making satisfactory progress toward the goal of proficiency in the state's learning standards in English language arts. To achieve this measure, all tested students must have a Performance Level Index (PLI) value that equals or exceeds the current year's English language arts AMO. The PLI is calculated by adding the sum of the percent of all tested students at Levels 2 through 4 with the sum of the percent of all tested students at Levels 3 and 4. Thus, the highest possible PLI is 200.<sup>3</sup>

#### Results

ICAHN 4 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> grade students achieved a Performance Index value of 138.9. Until the release of the AMO, a comparison cannot be made.

#### **Goal 1: Comparative Measure**

Each year, the school will exceed its predicted level of performance on the state English language arts exam by an Effect Size of 0.3 or above (performing higher than expected to a small degree) according to a regression analysis controlling for students eligible for economically disadvantaged students among all public schools in New York State.<sup>5</sup>

#### Method

The Charter Schools Institute conducts a Comparative Performance Analysis, which compares the school's performance to demographically similar public schools statewide. The Institute uses a regression analysis to control for the percentage of economically disadvantaged students among all public schools in New York State. The Institute compares the school's actual performance to the predicted performance of public schools with a similar economically disadvantaged percentage. The difference between the schools' actual and predicted performance, relative to other schools with similar economically disadvantaged statistics, produces an Effect Size. An Effect Size

of 0.3 or performing higher than expected to a small degree is the requirement for achieving this measure.

Given the timing of the state's release of economically disadvantaged data and the demands of the data analysis, the 2012-13 analysis is not yet available. This report contains 2011-12 results (using free-lunch eligible percentage), the most recent Comparative Performance Analysis available.

#### Results

In 2011-12 ICAHN 4 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grade students achieved and Effect Size of 3.28.

#### Goal 1: Growth Measure<sup>6</sup>

Each year, under the state's Growth Model, the school's mean unadjusted growth percentile in English language arts for all tested students in grades 4-8 will be above the state's unadjusted median growth percentile.

#### Method

This measure examines the change in performance of the same group of students from one year to the next and the progress they are making in comparison to other students with the same score in the previous year. The analysis only includes students who took the state exam in 2012-13 and also have a state exam score in 2011-12 including students who were retained in the same grade. Students with the same 2011-12 scores are ranked by their 2012-13 scores and assigned a percentile based on their relative growth in performance (mean growth percentile). Students' growth percentiles are aggregated school-wide to yield a school's mean growth percentile. In order for a school to perform above the statewide median, it must have a mean growth percentile greater than 50.

#### **Summary of the English Language Arts Goal**

ICAHN 4 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> grade student performance resulted in proficiencies percentages below the measure. Based on the new testing standards, they were 33% below the goal of 75% demonstrating proficiency.

The Performance Index value achieved by ICAHN 4 students was 138.9.

ICAHN 4 students outscored their peers in District 11, and in the following schools: PS 103, PS 83, PS 106, and PS/IS 194.

ICAHN 4 students achieved an Effect Size value of 3.38 in the 2011-12 comparative performance analysis. Their achievement was well above the required value of 0.3.

ICAHN 4  $4^{th}$  grade students achieved 100% in 2011-12 as compared with 80.3 in 2010-11 thereby demonstrating growth in ELA performance. The 2012-13 score is a new baseline and cannot be compared with 2010-11 or 2011-12.

#### **Action Plan**

ICAHN 4 completed its third testing year, with 2012-13 being the first year of the common corebased exam. ICAHN 4 students outscored their peers in District #11 and the schools identified by ICAHN 4 for comparison. In the coming year we plan to analyze the impact of our instruction on at risk students, and those scoring in the high Level 2 to low Level 3 range to identify possible changes we can introduce to support their increased academic achievement. Given the impact of the common core learning standards, we shall also review and adjust as needed student reading, writing, and listening skills.

#### **MATHEMATICS**

#### **Goal 1: Mathematics**

Students will demonstrate steady progress in the understanding and application of mathematical skills and concepts

#### **Background**

Our Mathematics curriculum follows the Core Knowledge sequence and is comprised of McGraw-Hill Mathematics Connect, workbooks, and a strong emphasis on hands on learning and monthly assessments. Our Mathematics specialist provides small group instruction for 45 minutes a day 5 days a week to those children who have demonstrated a deficiency in any area of Mathematics. The results of practice tests are reviewed with the Principal, teachers, mathematics specialist, and Mathematics consultant in order to provide remediation lessons for the targeted students. Our process of ongoing assessments ensures that the program will closely monitor the child's progress and promote the students out of targeted assistance where appropriate, as well as accept new students as required by practice tests and teacher recommendation. The Mathematics program is supervised by the Principal and with additional support from a Mathematics Consultant from the NYC Mathematics Project at Lehman College. The Mathematics Consultant is responsible for demonstration lessons and participates in developing teaching strategies. The mathematics consultant also provides professional development during common planning periods.

#### **Goal 1: Absolute Measure**

Each year, 75 percent of all tested students enrolled in at least their second year will perform at proficiency on the New York State mathematics examination for grades 3-8.8

Each year, the school's aggregate Performance Level Index (PLI) on the State mathematics exam will meet the Annual Measurable Objective (AMO) set forth in the state's NCLB accountability system.

#### Method

The federal No Child Left Behind law holds schools accountable for making annual yearly progress towards enabling all students to be proficient. As a result, the state sets an Annual Measurable Objective (AMO) each year to determine if schools are making satisfactory progress toward the goal of proficiency in the state's learning standards in mathematics. To achieve this measure, all tested students must have a Performance Level Index (PLI) value that equals or exceeds the current year's mathematics AMO. The PLI is calculated by adding the sum of the percent of all tested students at Levels 2 through 4 with the sum of the percent of all tested students at Levels 3 and 4. Thus, the highest possible PLI is 200.<sup>10</sup>

#### Results

ICAHN 4 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> grade students achieved a Performance Index value of 170.

#### **Goal 1: Comparative Measure**

Each year, the school will exceed its predicted level of performance on the state mathematics exam by an Effect Size of 0.3 or above (performing higher than expected to a small degree) according to a regression analysis controlling for students eligible for economically disadvantaged students among all public schools in New York State.<sup>12</sup>

#### Method

<sup>12</sup> The Institute will begin using *economically disadvantaged* instead of *eligibility for free lunch* as the demographic variable in 2012-13. Schools should report previous year's results using reported free-lunch statistics.

The Charter Schools Institute conducts a Comparative Performance Analysis, which compares the school's performance to demographically similar public schools statewide. The Institute uses a regression analysis to control for the percentage of economically disadvantaged students among all public schools in New York State. The Institute compares the school's actual performance to the predicted performance of public schools with a similar economically disadvantaged percentage. The difference between the schools' actual and predicted performance, relative to other schools with similar economically disadvantaged statistics, produces an Effect Size. An Effect Size of 0.3 or performing higher than expected to a small degree is the requirement for achieving this measure.

Given the timing of the state's release of economically disadvantaged data and the demands of the data analysis, the 2012-13 analysis is not yet available. This report contains 2011-12 results (using free-lunch eligible percentage), the most recent Comparative Performance Analysis available.

#### Results

In 2011-12 ICAHN 4 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grade students achieved and Effect Size of 2.43.

#### Goal 1: Growth Measure<sup>13</sup>

Each year, under the state's Growth Model, the school's mean unadjusted growth percentile in mathematics for all tested students in grades 4-8 will be above the state's unadjusted median growth percentile.

#### Method

This measure examines the change in performance of the same group of students from one year to the next and the progress they are making in comparison to other students with the same score in the previous year. The analysis only includes students who took the state exam in 2012-13 and also have a state exam score in 2011-12 including students who were retained in the same grade. Students with the same 2011-12 scores are ranked by their 2012-13 scores and assigned a percentile based on their relative growth in performance (mean growth percentile). Students' growth percentiles are aggregated school-wide to yield a school's mean growth percentile. In order for a school to perform above the statewide median, it must have a mean growth percentile greater than 50.

The State Education Department has not yet reported schools' mean growth percentiles for the 2012-13 school year.

#### **Summary of the Mathematics Goal**

ICAHN 4 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> grade students performed in a manner, which resulted in percent proficiencies below the measure. Based on the new testing standards, with 61.9%\_they were 13.1% below the goal of 75% demonstrating proficiency.

The Performance Index value achieved by ICAHN 4 students was 170.

ICAHN 4 students outscored their peers in District 11, and in the following schools: PS 103, PS 83, PS 106, and PS/IS 194.

ICAHN 4 students achieved an Effect Size value of 0.3 the 2011-12 comparative performance analysis. Their achievement was well above the required value of 2.43.

#### **Action Plan**

ICAHN 4 will continue utilizing the NYC Math Project as well as ongoing assessment and remediation as needed. In addition, we will continue to align our curriculum and provide current texts as the NYS Education Department modifies its mathematic strands. Additionally we shall use Pearson's SuccessMaker to meet every child's individual needs in mathematics. Given the impact of the common core learning standards, we shall also review and adjust as needed student reading, writing, and listening skills as they relate to mathematics.

#### **SCIENCE**

#### Goal 3: Science

Students will demonstrate competency in the understanding and application of scientific reasoning.

#### **Background**

The Icahn Charter School 4 science curriculum is aligned with the NYS standards and utilizes McGraw-Hill/National Geographic text.

#### **Goal 3: Absolute Measure**

Each year, 75 percent of all tested students enrolled in at least their second year will perform at proficiency on the New York State science examination.

#### Method

The school administered the New York State Testing Program science assessment to students in 4<sup>th</sup> grade in spring 2013. The school converted each student's raw score to a performance level and a grade-specific scaled score. The criterion for success on this measure requires students enrolled in at least their second year (defined as enrolled by BEDS day of the previous school year) to score at proficiency.

#### Results

100% of all students, including students with at least two years of enrollment at the school demonstrated proficiency. Thirty four of thirty five or 97% scored at Level 4.

Notes to Financial Statements June 30, 2013 and 2012

#### 1. NATURE OF OPERATIONS

The Icahn Charter School 4 (the "Charter School") is an educational corporation formed to operate a charter school located in the City of New York, County of the Bronx. On December 5, 2008 the Board of Regents of the University of the State of New York, for and on behalf of the State Education Department, granted a provisional charter valid for a term of five years, incorporating the Charter School. During fiscal 2013 the school underwent a five year review. As of the date of this report, the Charter School is waiting for the results, and it is expected that the Charter School will receive a full five year renewal charter expiring in fiscal 2018.

The central mission of the Charter School, using the Core Knowledge curriculum developed by E.D. Hirsch, is to provide students with a rigorous academic program offered in an extended day/year setting. Students are expected to graduate armed with the skills and knowledge to participate successfully in the most rigorous academic environments and have a sense of personal and community responsibility. The Charter School is coeducational and nonsectarian and commenced instruction on September 8, 2009.

The Charter School is exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code and is classified as an organization described in Section 501(c)(3).

#### 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **Basis of Presentation**

The Charter School prepares its financial statements on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with U.S. Generally Accepted Accounting Principles ("U.S. GAAP") and standards established by the Financial Accounting Standards Board for external financial reporting by not-for-profit organizations. Those standards require the classification of activities and net assets based upon the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions, as follows:

<u>Unrestricted</u> - Net assets that are not subject to donor-imposed stipulations and, therefore, may be expended for any purpose in performing the primary objective of the Charter School.

<u>Temporarily Restricted</u> - Net assets subject to donor-imposed restrictions that will be satisfied either by actions of the Charter School or the passage of time. At June 30, 2013 and 2012, the Charter School did not have any temporarily restricted net assets.

<u>Permanently Restricted</u> - Net assets subject to donor-imposed restrictions stipulating that the corpus be maintained in perpetuity by the Charter School, but permit the Charter School to expend all or part of the income derived there from. At June 30, 2013 and 2012, the Charter School did not have any permanently restricted net assets.

#### Revenue

Revenue is recorded on the accrual basis of accounting. The Charter School derives its revenue primarily from state and local capitation based on student enrollment, contributions and grants.

Notes to Financial Statements June 30, 2013 and 2012

Revenues are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets unless use of the related assets is limited by explicit donor-imposed restrictions. Public school district revenues (state and local capitation) received from the New York City Department of Education Office of Charter Schools are recognized over the period earned. Amounts received in advance are reported as deferred revenue.

Revenue from grants and contracts is recognized as the related expenses are incurred in accordance with the terms of the respective grant or contract agreement. Amounts received in advance are reported as deferred revenues.

The Charter School records contributions of cash and other assets when an unconditional promise to give such assets is received from a donor. Contributions are recorded at the fair market value of the assets received and are classified as either unrestricted, temporarily restricted or permanently restricted, depending on whether the donor has imposed a restriction on the use of such assets. All contributions receivable as of June 30, 3013 and 2012 are expected to be collected within one year.

The Charter School reports gifts of cash or other assets as temporarily restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donated assets. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statements of activities as net assets released from restrictions. Donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same fiscal year are reported as unrestricted revenues.

#### Receivables

Receivables outstanding longer than the payment terms are considered past due. The carrying value of the related receivables is reduced by an appropriate allowance for uncollectible accounts. The Charter School determines its allowance by considering a number of factors, including the length of time receivables are past due, the Charter School's previous loss history, the donor's current ability to pay its obligation, and the condition of the general economy and the industry as a whole. As of June 30, 2013 and 2012, there was no allowance for uncollectible receivables.

The Charter School writes off receivables when they are deemed to be uncollectible, and payments subsequently received on such receivables are recorded as income in the period received.

#### Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents are recorded at fair value, and are comprised of highly liquid financial instruments with original maturities of three months or less at the time of purchase. Included in Cash and Cash Equivalents at June 30, 2013 and 2012 is a reserve fund of \$75,000 to cover debts in the event of the Charter School's dissolution.

#### Concentration of Credit Risk

Certain financial instruments potentially subject the Charter School to concentration of credit risk. These financial instruments consist primarily of cash and cash equivalents. The Charter School maintains its cash in various bank accounts, which may exceed federally insured limits at times. The Charter School has not experienced, nor does it anticipate, any losses with respect to these bank accounts.

Notes to Financial Statements June 30, 2013 and 2012

#### **Capital Assets**

Furniture, fixtures, equipment, library and textbooks are stated at cost net of depreciation, or fair value at date of contribution, if donated. The Charter School capitalizes all property and equipment with a cost of at least \$500 and an estimated useful life of more than one year. Depreciation of furniture, fixtures, equipment, library, software and textbooks is computed in the month in which the assets are acquired, utilizing the straight-line basis, over their estimated useful lives, as follows:

#### **Taxes**

The Charter School recognizes or derecognizes a tax position based on a "more likely than not" threshold. This applies to positions taken or expected to be taken in a tax return. The Charter School evaluated its tax positions and concluded that there are no uncertain tax positions within its financial statements The tax years ended 2010, 2011, 2012, and 2013 are still open to audit for both federal and state purposes.

#### **Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### 3. CAPITAL ASSETS, NET

#### 4. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Certain payroll and legal services are provided at no cost by the Icahn Associates Corp. (the "Company"), a company affiliated with the Charter School. These amounts have not been reflected as in-kind contributions in the accompanying financial statements, as neither the Charter School nor the Company has a readily measurable or objective basis for determining such amounts.

The Charter School utilizes certain facilities provided by Inwood Opportunity, an organization affiliated with the Company, at no cost. The fair value of cost savings associated with such arrangement which totaled approximately \$159,000 and \$121,000 for the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012, is recognized as revenue within state and local grants, and also included within expenses in the statement of activities.

At June 30, 2013 and 2012, accounts payable and accrued expenses included approximately \$5,000 and \$8,000, respectively, for shared expenses payable to Icahn Charter School 1, an affiliated organization. Shared expenses include prorated salaries, based on student enrollment, for ten administrators at Icahn Charter School 1 who serve in management capacity at Icahn Charter School 4.

#### 5. CONCENTRATION OF REVENUES

The Charter School receives a majority of its revenues from the New York State Education Department through the New York City Department of Education Office of Charter Schools. The New York City Department of Education provides general operating support to the Charter School based upon the location and the number of students enrolled. Operating support provided to the Charter School by the New York City Department of Education totaled approximately \$2,985,000 and \$2,423,000 for the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012, respectively. The Charter School is dependent upon this level of funding in order to continue its operations.

#### 6. OBLIGATION UNDER CAPITAL LEASE

A long-term lease covering equipment is classified as a capital lease. Accordingly, equipment is capitalized as leased property and amortized on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease. The corresponding obligation under the capital lease represents the present value of the rental payments discounted by interest rates implicit in the lease agreement.

#### 7. PENSION PLAN

The Charter School has a defined contribution plan (the "Plan"), administered by T. Rowe Price, for all full-time personnel. Contributions by the Charter School to the Plan totaled approximately \$54,000 and \$51,000 for the years ended June 30, 2013 and 2012, respectively.

#### 8. COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENCIES

#### **Government Agency Audits**

The Charter School participates in a number of federal and state programs. These programs require that the Charter School comply with certain requirements of laws, regulations, contracts, and agreements applicable to the programs in which it participates. All funds expended in connection with government grants and contracts are subject to audit by government agencies. While the ultimate liability, if any, from such audits of government contracts by government agencies is presently not determinable, it should not, in the opinion of management, have a material effect on the Charter School's financial position or change in net assets. Accordingly, no provision for any such liability that may result has been made in the accompanying financial statements.

#### Litigation

The Charter School may be involved in various legal actions from time to time arising in the normal course of business. In the opinion of management, there are no matters outstanding that would have a material adverse effect on the financial statements of the Charter School.

#### 9. CONTRIBUTED SERVICES

The Charter School utilizes certain transportation and food services provided by the New York City public school system at no cost. The Charter School is unable to determine the fair value for these services, and as such this is not reflected on the accompanying financial statements.

#### 10. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Charter School evaluated its June 30, 2013 financial statements for subsequent events through October, 2013, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. The Charter School is not aware of any subsequent events which would require recognition or disclosure in the accompanying financial statements.

We have audited, in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States, the financial statements of lcahn Charter School 4 (the "Charter School"), which comprise the statement of financial position as of June 30, 2013, and the related statements of activities and cash flows for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements, and have issued our report thereon dated October 31, 2013.

#### Internal control over financial reporting

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements, we considered the Charter School's internal control over financial reporting ("internal control") to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the Charter School's internal control.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the Charter School's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses. Given these limitations, during our audit we did not identify any deficiencies in the Charter School's internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, material weaknesses may exist that have not been identified.

#### Compliance and other matters

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the Charter School's financial statements are free from material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the determination of financial statement amounts. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit, and accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*.

#### Intended purpose

The purpose of this report is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control and compliance and the results of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on the effectiveness of the Charter School's internal control or on compliance. This report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with Government Auditing Standards in considering the Charter School's internal control and compliance. Accordingly, this report is not suitable for any other purpose.

#### I. Enrollment and Retention Targets

ICAHN 1-7 has undertaken efforts throughout the charter period to attract and retain students with disabilities and English language learners. During the student application process, school literature in both English and Spanish is distributed throughout CSD 9 for Icahn 1, CSD 11 for Icahn 2-5, CSD 9 for Icahn 6 and CSD 8 for Icahn 7. Specific community outreach efforts and interactions with local schools serving significant relevant student populations are carried out.

Provisions for the attraction and retention of students with disabilities and English language learners are contained in the ICAHN 1-7 Student Enrollment and Retention Plan, which was designed to facilitate the meeting or exceeding of enrollment and retention target student populations established by the SUNY Trustees for:

- Students with disabilities,
- Students who are English language learners
- Students who are eligible to participate in the federal free and reduced-price lunch program.

**Recruitment** - Formal recruitment of prospective students with disabilities and those who are English language learners (ELLs) begins each year on February 1st. ICAHN 1-7 advertises an open registration process in the English and Spanish languages. If they choose, families of these students can meet with ICAHN 1 staff members and review the expectations of the school. ICAHN 1-7 maintains a policy of equitable admissions access to all students in every phase of its admissions process. ICAHN 1-7 shall not discriminate against any student based on race, ethnicity, national origin, gender, or disability or for any other basis that would be unlawful for a public school. Icahn 1 shall be open to any child who is eligible under the laws of New York State for admission to a public school, and ICAHN 1-7 shall ensure compliance with all applicable anti-discrimination laws governing public schools, including Title VI of the Civil Rights Act and Paragraph 2854 (2) of the New York Education Law, governing admission to a charter school. New students will be admitted each year without regard to prior measures of achievement or aptitude, athletic ability, disability, handicapped condition, ethnicity, race, creed, gender, national origin, religion, or ancestry. Interested families will submit applications during the period between February 1st and April 1st, at which point students will be accepted. If the number of applicants to ICAHN 1 exceeds capacity, a lottery or a random selection process will be conducted. The lottery will be held within the first week of April.

**Outreach** – ICAHN 1-7 will undertake the measures below, among others, to recruit student applicants, including students with disabilities and English language learners (and will provide translation services, if necessary, for all promotional materials and any person-to-person interaction requiring an English translation):

- (1) Posting flyers and placing notices in local Spanish language newspapers, supermarkets, churches, community centers, apartment complexes, and local daycare centers
- (2) Conducting open houses at after-school programs and youth centers;
- (3) Visiting local organizations in surrounding neighborhoods, speaking at community meetings and distributing information packets; and
- (4) Canvassing neighborhoods to further reach interested families.

Specific measures will be designed and implemented to reach parents for/of:

- Whom English is not their primary language
- Students with disabilities
- Students who would qualify for free or reduced-price lunch
